



WOLVERINES



Today I will share with you a few facts about an amazing animal. It is small yet ferocious beast. Yes! I am talking about the wolverine.

No, not the Marvel superhero. I'm talking about the real animal that inspired the character.

The wolverine, or Gulo Gulo if you're using its scientific name, is the largest weasel of the family Mustelidae. Though, those are some nerdy facts. I'll just get into the cool side of this animal.

They are very reclusive, living alone in the most extreme and remote places: far Russia, the coldest parts of Canada and the frozen tundras of the Alpines. They don't like to be around other wolverines and will often fight them if they find any other individuals on their territory.

The fierce little beasts are usually brown with tan and black. They resemble little bears, really, though they aren't really related. They can grow to almost four feet long, including the tail. Completely disproportionate to their relatively small frame, they have enormous strength. They have been documented taking down prey three times its own size.

Wolverines are usually between 40 and 70 pounds. They can run up to twenty miles an hour, which means they could easily catch a normal human running away. They have long, sharp claws that easily shear flesh. Because of their plantigrade stance—plantigrade meaning walking on the soles of their feet, like a human—they can easily scale cliff faces and trees, even in snow and ice.

They survive in some of the harshest places on earth, which is amazing in itself, but they also thrive! They are a least concern on the Conversation List. That means there is almost no reason to worry about them going extinct.

Wolverines eat a wide variety things. This includes, but is not limited to: birds, which they will catch in trees, deer that are much larger than wolverines, gofers and rabbits, and even beavers and marmots. They will catch anything that they can, eating any meat available to them. They are very opportunistic hunters.

I hope you have enjoyed this short bio on the wolverine. They are amazing animals, who are small but still don't back down against much larger predators and are impressive hunters. Considering where they live and their competitors—including bears, wolves, and other wolverines—it is incredible that they live such long lives: often surviving as individuals, only seeing other wolverines when they fight for territory or mate, for up to 13 years.
