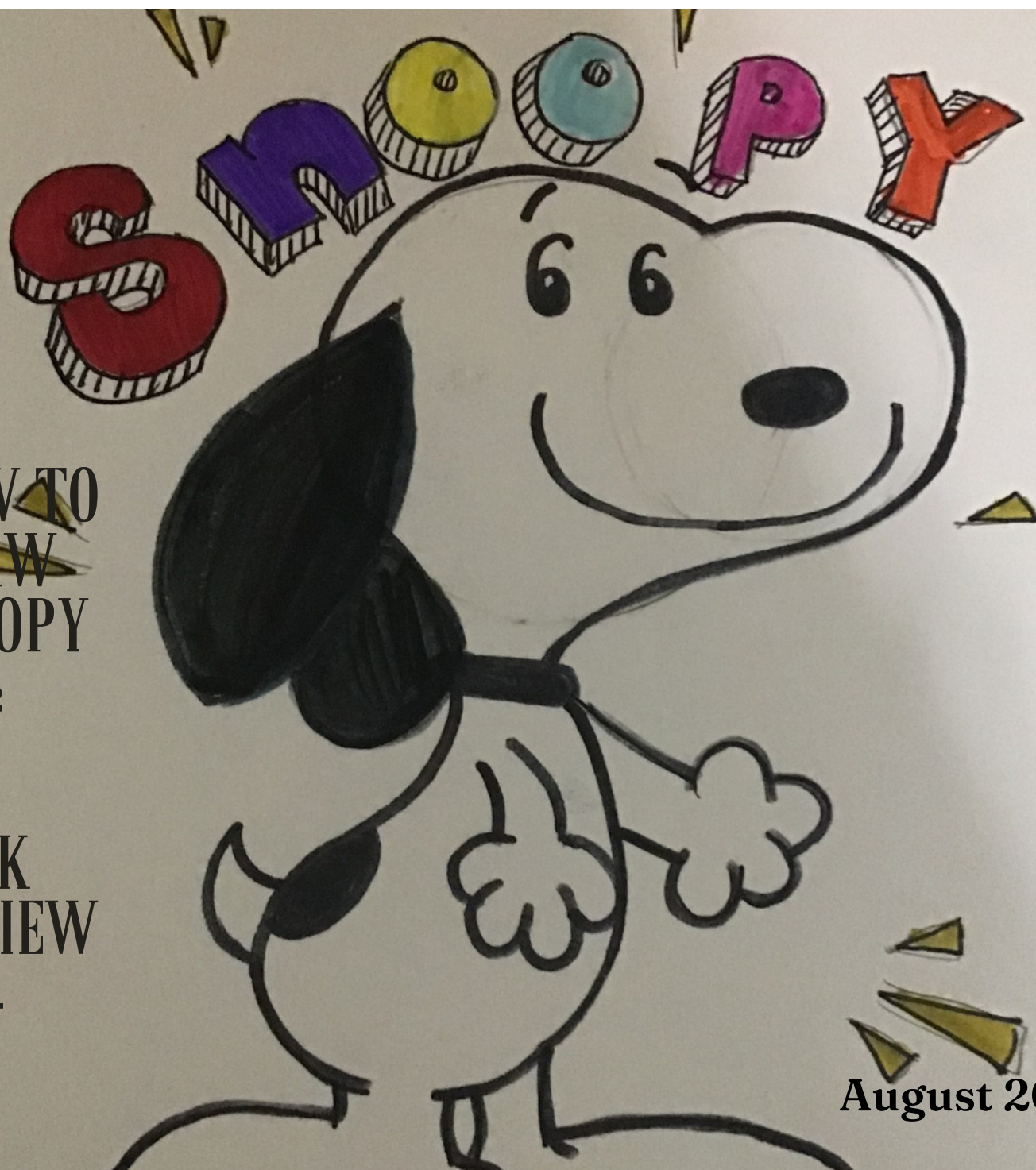

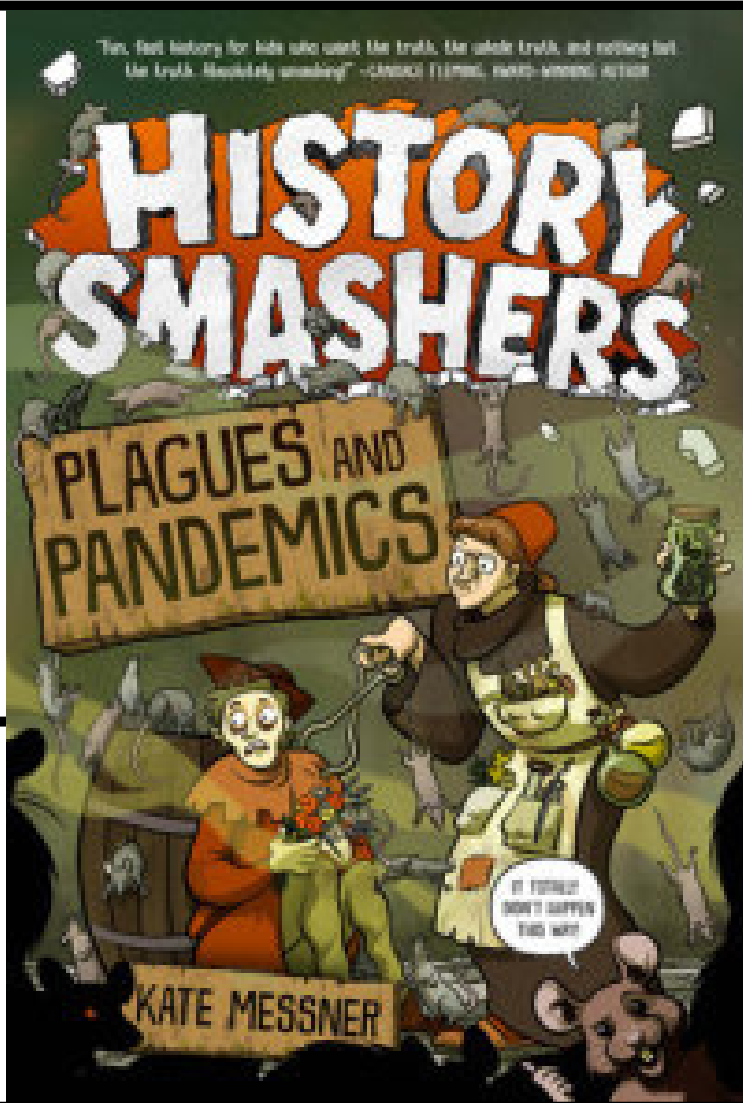

# Raising Chickens

**Chickens are a part of God's creation. They are useful to humans in many ways. Chickens instinctively work and can provide humans with nutritious food in the form of meat and eggs.**

**What is the history of chickens? The Bible tells us in Genesis 1 that "God created the great sea creatures and every living creature that moves, with which the waters swarmed, according to their kind, and every winged bird according to its kind; and God saw that it was good." We know from scripture that chickens were created on the fifth day.**

**The ancestors of the chickens we have today were wild birds. Because they were wild, their life expectancy was shorter than it is in our generation. In earlier times, a chicken could live 2-4 years at the very most, and in order to do so, they would have had to survive harsh weather conditions and predator attacks. In the mid-1800s, people began catching chickens and taming them. The owners of these birds changed the chicken's habitats in order to better protect them from threatening weather and other animals. Due to these changes, the life expectancy for protected backyard chickens can be 3-10 years.**

**Today's chicken owners still must work to keep their flocks safe and healthy. We have learned how to care for our birds better than in past generations, and we have more resources to keep them from catching diseases and heal from illnesses when they are infected. Owners also have ways to help injured birds heal from attacks when they happen.**

**In the past, chickens were regularly housed in barns with other farm animals. The other animals could step on the chickens and kill them.**

**Over the years, people have learned how to improve their chicken coops and make them more secure. Improvements in their housing conditions have helped backyard chickens to be protected from farm accidents, attacks from other birds, and harsh weather conditions. People have also learned more about the nutritional needs of chickens.**

**Improvements to their diets have helped them to live longer, be healthier, and produce higher quality meat and eggs.**

**Speaking of eggs, you may be wondering how often a hen lays an egg. Each hen has the ability to lay an egg every 24-27 hours. The amount of daylight hours has a great impact on a hen's egg laying cycle. When the amount of daylight time per day reaches 12 hours in the spring, hens will be able to regularly produce eggs. Maximum egg laying happens when daylight time per day is 16 hours. Since a hen is so sensitive to light exposure, eventually the hen will lay an egg too late in the day for the cycle to begin again before nightfall. When this happens, that hen will skip one or more days before the egg laying cycle will begin again.**

**Weather also has a big effect on the egg cycle. Ideal temperatures for egg laying are between 65 and 75 degrees Fahrenheit. When the temperature reaches 85-90 degrees Fahrenheit, the size of the eggs and the quality of the eggs begins to decrease. If the temperature goes above 90 degrees, the hen may stop laying in order to reduce stress on her own body. When the temperature rises to above 100 degrees, chickens should be cooled down to keep them from overheating.**

**Overheating can be fatal to chickens.**

**There are other factors that can cause a hen to stop laying eggs. Illness, parasites, stress, and old age can all cause laying to cease. Different breeds will naturally stop laying eggs at different ages. Chickens are fun animals to watch and take care of. Owners have learned better ways over time to raise healthy and productive birds.**
